Introduction :::::::

2024 was an exciting and impactful year for Civic Health Alliance as we continued to advance our mission to advance America's health through civic engagement in care settings and communities. We began the year with a focus on expanding partnerships and closed the year with the first partnership between a civic health non-profit organization and an academic medical center, NYU Langone Health.

Whether through Civic Health Alliance's RxVote campaign, which aims to mobilize health care professionals and the communities we serve to vote or through social media chats, CHA increased our impact as a non-partisan mobilizing network. We did this by curating easy-to-use and customizable resources, convening regular discussions to advance our efforts and the efforts of our partners, and learning, testing, and celebrating promising practices and initiatives. For the 2024 presidential election,, Civic Health Alliance undertook a strategic campaign to achieve the following:



Strategic Aims

- Reach 1.5 million voters
- Register 1,500 individuals to vote
- Establish two new partnerships
- Host three voter registration events in partnership with a health care institution
- Share We Will Vote
 Campaign widely

In 2024 We Hosted Seven Webinars

We hosted 7 webinars, reaching over **700 viewers** to increase civic participation amongst health care professionals and the communities we serve. The webinars were focused on how health care delivery organizations can get involved in civic engagement, understanding the relationship between civic engagement and health, and how we remain civically activated after the elections cycle.





Launched the We Will Vote Campaign

In 2024 Civic Health Alliance, Healthy Democracy Healthy People, and Vot-ER came together to partner on a strategic initiative (We Will Vote) to engage our organizations, employees, members, and those we serve in a coordinated effort to increase voter participation.

With your support we have grown as a coalition to represent over 100,000 health professionals. We could not have reached this milestone without you. We Will Vote initiative signed on 85 partners which represent over 261,000,000 health professionals across the country.

As a part of the We Will Vote initiative, the collaboration developed a Communications Toolkit to facilitate communication with organization members, leaders, workers, and community about the importance of voting for community health. The communications toolkit included social media posts, email signatures, action items, and graphics for distribution.

Fostering Resilience and Advocacy by Direct Communication with Key Legislators



In 2024, Civic Health Alliance provided key support and partnership for four letters promoting civic health across the nation. In particular, Civic Health Alliance signed onto letters urging President Biden to publish and protect the Equal Rights Amendment. The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) is a constitutional amendment that would guarantee equal rights under the law for all people, regardless of sex. The ERA would expressly prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex. This letter emphasizes the prospective impact of the ERA on reproductive justice.
